Recommendations of the DRC made in its meeting held on 22 March 2021 regarding change/modification in the M.Phil. /Ph.D. course work of the Department of Persian.

As per the **Notification** (Amendment to Ordinance dated 09.08.2017) issued by Research Council, University of Delhi, the overall minimum credits assigned to complete M.Phil./Ph.D. coursework should not be less than 08 credits and a maximum of 16 credits and a part from this 12 credits (300 Marks) have been assigned for dissertation and viva-voce.

In compliance to the said notification the DRC of the Department of Persian unanimously decided to keep 26 credits (650 marks) for the completion of the M.Phil. /Ph.D. course. The distribution of the credits/marks is given below:-

#### M.Phil. / Ph.D. Course Work in Persian

#### **General Guidelines:**

- 1. The course work for M.Phil. / Ph.D. courses will be common.
- 2. 4 credits/100 marks are assigned for each paper. All papers are compulsory.
- 3. All research scholars of Ph.D. program shall be required to complete the coursework within initial one or two semesters.
- 4. Every research scholar admitted to M.Phil. /Ph.D. courses must obtain 55% marks in course work examination in order to be eligible for submission of dissertation/ thesis.
- 5. The minimum percentage of compulsory attendance during the course work will be two-third of the total lectures delivered during the course work.
- 6. Research scholars shall be required to participate in all the seminars/lectures arranged in the department during the course work.
- 7. As per the UGC regulations 2016, Ph.D. program shall be for a minimum duration of three (3) years from the date of registration, including coursework and up to a maximum of six years.

# **Structure of Examination and Division of Marks**

- (i) Five questions in all papers would be asked and each question carries 10 marks.
- (ii) 50 marks will be based on assignment.
- (iii) The students shall be required to attempt 60% answer of the paper in Persian language.
- (iv) The student shall require having 60% attendance to appear in the Examination.
- (v) The candidate should obtain at least 50% marks in each paper to pass.

Maximum Marks: 100 (Written = 50 + Assignment = 50) Credits: 4

#### Paper II – Persian Paleography

Maximum Marks: 100 (Written = 50 + Assignment = 50) **Credits: 4** 

#### Paper III – History of the particular period

Maximum Marks: 100 (Written = 50 + Assignment = 50) **Credits: 4** 

### **Paper IV – Research and Publication Ethics**

Maximum Marks: 50 (Written = 50) Credits: 2

# **Objectives of the Course**

- To make the Scholars understand basic concepts of research and its methodologies.
- To identify appropriate research topics and systematic research in the field of Language, Literature and Culture.
- To select and define appropriate research problem and parameters.
- To organize and conduct research in a more appropriate manner.
- To prepare scholars for writing research reports, dissertation and thesis.
- To trained the scholar for editing of classical Persian Texts.
- To develop the skills for deciphering Indo-Persian Texts.

#### **Outcomes of the Course**

- Students will understand idea and definition of research methods.
- Students will get acquainted with the process of literary research and the audiences that profit from this kind of research.
- Students will be able to identify a research problem stated in a study.
- They will be able to identify the overall process of designing a research study from its inception to its report.
- They will be familiar with how to write a good introduction to an educational research study and the components that comprise such an introduction
- They will be familiar with ethical issues involved in educational research, including those issues which may arise while doing quantitative and qualitative research work.
- Student would be able to get acquainted with different styles of Persian script.
